




3. I agree that I will make no use of the interview or the information contained therein until it is published, or until I receive permission from the Society.

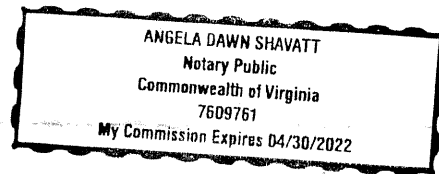


