

# Senate Pres. Elect Outlines Year

Mark Tuohey, leaning back in the new Student Senate headquarters in the University Center, remarked that the foundation for a better student-Senate relationship has been laid this

year. Tuohey was elected Wednesday by the student body the 1967-68 Senate President. Edward Murray will serve as Vice-President.

Twenty-one years ago, Tuohey's father Mark H. Tuohey, Jr., sat as Student Senate President of the Class of 1947.

President-elect Tuohey hinted that there will be some reorganizations of the Senate, especially in the committee set-up. "This extension will definitely allow individual senators and the senate as a body to become more aware of this University's problems."

On the question of committee reorganization, the junior history major from Rochester noted that no standing committees will be abolished but the extensions will allow the senate to act as an executive and legislative body.

"It is more of an extension to include more students in Senate activities such as the social, cultural and special events projects. With these modifications more ideas will flow in these areas. Action always follows interest."

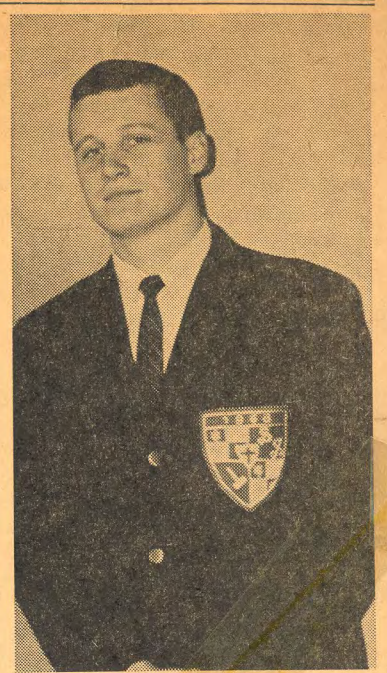
Commenting on the recent administration changes, Tuohey felt the new president and administration will create a sense of awareness that is needed at Bonaventure.

"This year has established a foundation and philosophy for student activities and govern-

ment to adapt readily to the forthcoming transition period of change."

On this foundation, next year's Senate "will act as the crystal-lizer center, as the voice of the student body, to complement his foundation and to lead the students of St. Bonaventure Univ." Tuohey also added that it will take longer to fully realize the aims and aspirations than one year but the sense of direction will be followed.

"In the words of University President, the Very Rev. Reginald Redlon, OFM," Tuohey said, "I can only reiterate, that we in the Senate will do everything we can to make this university a great one."

## Students Elect Senators, Officers, In 65% Turnout

Sixty-five per cent of the eligible student voters went to the polls Wednesday and elected Mark Tuohey President of next year's Student Senate and Edward Murray vice-president.

Other senior senators for next year are Jay Asip, John Barrett, Robert Pastore and Albert Wilt.

Officers for the Class of 1968 are President Jack Huldie, Vice-President Kevin Culhane, Secretary Maureen Miller and Treasurer Bill Butler.

More than 67 per cent of the class voted.

Next year's junior senators are incumbents David Aud, Miss Geraldine Haag and Roger Youngs; Andrew Knauf, present class president and James Leddy.

Junior officers for the next year are Frank Tercek, president, Dave McClave, vice-president, incumbent Evie Zebrowski, secretary and John McGary, treasurer.

Sixty-eight per cent of the sophomores voted.

The sophomore Senate positions for next year went to Frank Costanzo, present class president, Gerald Dickinson, John Kucij and William Leonard.

Officers for the Class of 1970 will be George Bailey as president, Jeff Moritz, vice-president, Miss Patricia O'Brien, secretary and Vic Andrijauskas, treasurer. Sixty per cent of the freshman class voted.
